**7-Period School Day Proposed**

A seven-period day for selected students in Torrance's three high schools is planned next fall, according to Dr. Albert Posner, assistant superintendent of schools. About 200 students would be involved.

At the same time, the program of sending top students to El Camino for an extra class will be continued and expanded, he said. This spring, two North High students attended El Camino College for an extra class. More students from all three high schools are expected to attend next fall.

The seven-period day at the high schools will go into effect on a trial basis in the fall. Qualified sophomores will take one additional class per day, giving an opportunity for additional classes. A heavy number of requirements, particularly for college-bound youngsters, makes it hard to crowd in all the courses students would like, Posner reported.

Students will be picked for these additional classes on the basis of a demonstration of their ability to handle the work. If their work falls below par, they will be required to drop the extra classes. Students apply for the extra work.

**Bids to Be Called in June for Dominguez Channel Job**

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced today that the Board of Supervisors has approved the final plans and specifications for the third unit of the permanent, multi-stage improvement of Dominguez channel and has issued a call for construction bids to be opened June 26.

Project calls for the construction of a reinforced concrete open box structure between Gramercy pl. and Redondo Beach blvd. It will also include construction of new bridges over the channel at Redondo Beach blvd., Cherry ave., Crenshaw blvd., and Arlington ave.

He pointed out that all of the 1952 bond issue storm drains built in the Lennox, Hawthorne, Lawndale, Gardena and North Torrance areas have their outlets into the channel.

The project will deepen and widen this segment of the channel. The permanent channel will have a width of 75 feet on a right of way of 125 feet. Depth will be increased to approximately 18 feet.

Supervisor Hahn explained that the new bridges will also serve to reduce the flood hazard. Present bridges over the channel, with the water passing through small culverts, have been a major factor in past flooding of some areas in North Torrance and Lawndale. Debris would jam against the culverts, damming the water and causing it to back up and overflow the banks of the channel.

The new bridges will provide an unobstructed passage for storm waters. Detours at the bridges will be necessary during the construction, but every effort will be made to hold public inconvenience to a minimum, Hahn said.

If satisfactory bids are received on the project in June, actual construction should be started in July, Supervisor Hahn said. About 500 calendar days will be work.

In the meantime, work is proceeding satisfactorily on the second unit of the improvement program for the channel. This latter project improves the channel between Denker ave., and Gramercy pl.

New bridges have been completed on Western ave., and at Gramercy and the excavation for the channel has been virtually completed. Next step is the placing of forms for the pouring of the concrete bottom and sides of the channel. This job is scheduled to be completed and ready for use this fall.

First unit of the five year program was completed last year. It included construction of a channel section on a new alignment south of and parallel to Artesia blvd., between Vermont ave. and Denker ave.
