The following are the proposed Hunting regulations and seasons:

Deer—Early season August 8th through Sept. 20.
Inland Sept. 19 through Oct. 25.
Archery Early July 25 to Aug. 3.

Inland Sept. 5 through 14.
Bear—Open same as Deer, close Jan. 15.
Quail—Southern Counties Nov. 14 through Jan. 3.
Chuker—Opens Oct. 31.
Pheasant—Coop areas Nov. 14 through 23, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
Rabbits—Jacks—No closed season. No limit.

Brush, Snowshoe, Cottontail, and Pigmy. Open Sept. 1, closes end of Quail season.

The biggest change is the addition of a Hen Pheasant in the total bag of 10 per season.

The early Deer season would open 6 days later than last year. Also there is a 2 day overlap between the early and late season.

All of Los Angeles county will be in the late season as a 1 Buck area.

These proposals will be acted on May 29, in Sacramento.

Registration for Summer Swim Classes Begins Today

It's almost splashing time again, and registration for learn-to-swim classes at Benstead Municipal Plunge begins today, according to the Torrance Recreation Dept.

Registration for the "water-proofing" sessions will be conducted at the pool, 3831 Torrance Blvd., from 1 until 5 and 6 until 9 p.m. today and tomorrow, 9 a.m. until noon and 1 until 5 p.m., Saturday, 1 until 5 p.m., Sunday.

Beginning June 15, there will be two-week-long classes for children with groups meeting weekdays at 9, 10, and 11 a.m. These will continue through Sept. 4. Pool charge for each 10-lesson series is \$2.

Classes for adult beginning swimmers are planned to meet at 5:30 and 6:30 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays, June 23 through July 16 and July 28 through Aug. 28. The fee for eight lessons is \$2.

Beginning, intermediate and advanced teen-aged swimmers may get instruction during 5:30 and 6:30 p.m. classes on Mondays and Wednesdays from June 22 through 15 and July 27 through Aug. 19. There will be an eight lesson charge of \$2.

Junior and senior lifesaving courses will be offered at 5 on Mondays, Wednesdays and Friday. Classes will begin June 22 and July 27.

Water safety instruction for adult non-swimmers and swimmers will be given at 5:30 Fridays with sessions starting June 19, July 3, July 31 and Aug. 4.

Diving classes will meet 5 p.m. Tuesdays for persons under 16 years of age and Thursdays for those older starting June 23.

Synchronized swimming for children and teenagers will be taught at 5:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays starting June 23.

The plunge will open for general recreational swimming on June 15.
