and that he had become unobjective and irrational. I felt it was beneath my dignity to continue my fight for better engineering under conditions such as these," he said.

Bishop claimed that a majority of the Council suggested he continue as acting engineer and senior design engineer with no reduction in salary.

"I did so until I recently learned that the long continuing harassment of Stevens and Blount was to resume. Knowing full well how my abilities would be endangered by such conduct, I resigned finally and emphatically from my employment with the city," he added.

Bishop said that he was making the accusations because he wants to clear his professional reputation, "because things leave me somewhat smeared."

Stevens yesterday morning declined to answer the former engineer, but said he might comment later.
