Recommendation that outside engineering firms design major flood control projects here out of a county-wide storm drain bond issue, was made Tuesday by Wade E. Peebles, director of public works.  
 He said that it is a necessity to expedite the work and also that his staff is not completely equipped to take on such major projects.  
 Peebles said there is, however, a great amount of lateral and feeder line work which could be done by the city staff provided the major projects, including Walteria, Walteria Lake and Torrance, are done by a private firm.  
 Funds for the multi-million dollar flood project are now available in the banks, waiting for the city to complete its plans, it was learned.  
 Former City Engineer Ronald W. Bishop, who quit two weeks ago, was originally slated to draw the plans.
