School Chief Gets Belated Salary Hike

School Superintendent J. H. Hill, only Torrance school employe who did not get a pay raise last year, got one Tuesday night—a year late. The School Board voted to increase the salary to \$20,500. In figuring the increase, the board used the same percentage of increase as that given other employes since his last raise two years ago. A legal technicality—requiring that the superintendent's salary be raised before July 1—barred him from a raise last year. The board previously indicated that it hopes to be able to raise salaries of all district employes this year, but must wait until final budget and assessed valuation figures are compiled later this summer.
