See Cost Cutting in Park Move

Transfer of Park Department offices, designed to top off operating costs, is expected to be completed Monday, Wade Peebles, public works director, announced this week.

He said that moving the park office from Torrance Park to the City Yard will save the city between \$25,000 to \$30,000 a year.

He explained that savings will be realized by pooling of equipment with other departments, joint use of office facilities, clerical staff and telephones.

Peebles said he "hopes" to be able to appoint a new city engineer within two weeks. A civil service examination, the third since Ronald W. Bishop resigned the post last December, will be given Saturday.
