

### Stevens Silent in 'Feud'

The one-sided feud between City Manager George Stevens and former City Engineer Ronald Bishop appeared to have reached an impasse this week. Stevens said he is certainly not

going to accept the suggestion by his former aide that he resign. As a matter of fact Stevens reiterated that he is "too busy with Torrance's future to engage in arguments over the past."

Bishop, who charged that Stevens and Councilman Willys Blount had "hamstrung" the engineering department, said Tuesday that he has nothing to add. "I have no further action in

mind at this time," declared the former engineer who resigned June 1.

But, he explained, he felt he had performed a public duty by calling the attention of the citizens to a shortage of engineering personnel.
