

670 High School Seniors to Receive Diplomas Today

Graduation ceremonies for some 670 high school seniors and 1370 graders in Torrance schools will be held this evening at schools throughout the city.

North High School's graduation rites will be held at 7:30 p.m. in Murdock Stadium, El Camino College. Some 465 students will get their diplomas.






