
Yell kings and El Camettes will also add to the spirited display on the sidelines at Warrior games, with the assistance of the college band.

**Roger Others Aided by 'K' Day Fund Campaign**

Nine-year-old Roger Roseberry lives at 21718 Vickey Ave. with his mother and father, Beverly and William Roseberry, and his two sisters, Darlene, 11, and Pat, aged 15. Although neither of the girls are so afflicted, Roger has nephrosis, a form of kidney disease, and has had it for over four and one-half years. Kidney disease is the nation's fourth ranking killer. It hits 3,000,000 victims annually and kills 30,000. In California it attacks 250,000 and kills 3000. There are thousands of children in Greater Los Angeles who, like Roger, have either nephrosis or nephritis, and the treatment for the disease is extremely costly. During the month of June the National Kidney Disease foundation is conducting a fund raising drive with Sunday, June 28 designated as "K Day." Funds raised will be used to provide free medication and care for needy patients and for medical research grants, according to motion picture actress, Miss Linda Darnell, who is chairman of the drive.
