



8800 Students to Begin Summer Sessions

Summer classes for some 8800 students in the Torrance schools will get under way tomorrow at all schools, except where construction is under way. Classes will begin at South High and Torrance High at 8 a. m., running through noon. North High students will attend classes at South High School, due to construction work. Buses to pick up students from North High to South High will leave North High and Steele

Elementary School at 7:30 a. m. each day. They also will return the students. Elementary schools will start from 8 to 8:30 a. m., depending on the schools. Time schedules are as follows:
8-12:20—Anza, Magruder and Walteria Schools.
8:10-12:30—Edison.
8:15-12:35—Arlington, Calle Mayor, Casimir, Crenshaw, Flavian, Lincoln, Hamilton, Newton, Parkway, Perry, Riviera, Seaside, Sepulveda, Steele and Yukon.
8:30-12:50—Carr, Greenwood, Hillside, Jefferson, Madrona, Meadow Park, Torrance Elementary and Wood.
All elementary schools except Fern, which will be the scene of construction, are open. All elementary children are with-

in walking distance of their schools. Crossing guards will be maintained at the busiest intersections. Summer school elementary principals will be the same as those during the regular year with the exception of Yukon school, where Victor Kilburn will take over for the summer; Madrona School, where Martin Beudet will act for part of the summer; and Seaside School, where William Zecher will take over. Kilburn, regular a dult principal, and Beudet, a vice-principal, will act for the summer only. Zecher just was named to the new post.

High school principals for the summer will be John Lucas, South High; Leonard Dalton, North High; and Marcus Caldwell, Torrance High. All South High students will report to the gym. North High School students, although they will be bussed to South High School, will meet tomorrow at 8 a. m. At this time they will receive class schedules, maps of the SHS campus, and instructions. At 9:30, NHS students will take busses to South High. The busses will return at 12:10. After the first day, busses will leave at 7:30 a. m. from North High and Steele School and from South High at 12:10. Students who are taking only one high school summer school class must provide their own transportation at least one way.
