

Sump Golf Course Hit by Neighbors

Councilmen turned down a proposal to lease a sump for a privately operated golf course when a protest petition was submitted Tuesday by adjacent property owners.

The petition containing the names of 61 residents was presented by William Deul, 19805 Halison St.

The Park and Recreation Commission had requested the City Council for authority to negotiate for a 15-year lease on the 27-acre Entradero sump to a private developer who would pay the city up to \$5000 a year.

Deul said that neighbors objected because of jeopardy from golf balls, limited access to the sump, possible undesirable elements, and greater police protection.

Slope Erosion Problem Seen by Winter Rains

Because of possible erosion problems next winter, no weed abatement program should be applied on hillside lots.

This was the recommendation Tuesday of Wade E. Peebles, public works director, following a field inspection.

He said that hand hoeing or discing will leave the area completely exposed to extreme and disastrous erosion possibilities during inclement weather.

Peebles also noted that the lack of rain last winter the plant life will have a difficult time to survive, which would constitute an erosion danger next rainy season.


