Boundary Changes for School District Given to Board

Revised boundary descriptions for several Torrance schools were presented to the Torrance Board of Education for study Tuesday night. They will be acted upon later.

The changes would include transfer of an area bounded by Vista Montana, Via Lado, Wilmington St. and Newton St. to the Newton Elementary School area from the WALTERIA School area. The change was made at the request of area residents.

The only other major change would provide that students who live in the newly-annexed Victor Tract area would attend elementary school at Meadow Park Elementary School until Victor School can be completed. High school students from this area would attend Torrance High School. The Victor Tract is bounded by Del Amo, Hawthorne, Torrance Blvd., and the Redondo Beach city boundary.

South High will have a senior class for the first time this fall, with all students who live west of Hawthorne and south of Tor-

rance Blvd. at SHS, as well as students in the Meadow Park, WALTERIA, and Hillside Elementary attendance areas.

The North High boundaries would take in all students living north of 190th St., plus those who live west of Hawthorne and north of Del Amo.

Torrance High students will include those from the Victor Tract, plus students in the Fern-Greenwood, Madrona, Torrance Elementary, and Wood attendance areas.


