NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a resolution adopted on September 23, 1951, by the said Board of Supervisors under the authority of Section 6245 of the Streets and Highways Code, the County Engineer of the County of Los Angeles, in a public meeting called by him for that purpose, publicly opened and examined the bids for the construction of sewers in Benton Street and other rights of way, under County Improvement No. 2095, bidding to the Board of Supervisors, which Board awarded the contract for said construction work and improvement, on the 14th day of July, 1959, to the lowest responsible bidder, to wit: Jerry Artakovich Const. Co. at the price named in the bid for such work on file in the office of the Clerk of said Board of Supervisors.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Diagram and Assessment in the matter of County Improvement No. 2095-M (Flat Street) of the County of Los Angeles, for the acquisition of rights of way and the construction of sanitary sewers in the vicinity of Torrance, have been recorded in the Office of the County Engineer of the County of Los Angeles on the 9th day of July, 1959, and that all sums assessed in said Diagram and Assessment became due and payable upon the recording of said Diagram and Assessment, and that the payment of the sums is to be made to said County Engineer within thirty (30) days after the date of recording of the Diagram and Assessment, and if not paid within thirty (30) days thereafter, except for all unpaid assessments for which bonds are to be issued, shall become delinquent and thereupon, for all assessments unpaid for which bonds are not to be issued five (5) per cent. of the amount of such such assessments shall be added thereto, and the property advertised for sale, as provided for by law.

Serial bonds shall be issued in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code (Improvement Act of 1911), to represent such assessment of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more remaining unpaid for thirty (30) days after the date of the recording of Diagram and Assessment for this improvement. The serial bonds shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the next October fifteenth following their date.

The principal sum shall become due and payable in equal annual payments on the 15th day of each November succeeding the October 15th following their date until fully paid.

The first interest payment shall be payable on the 15th day of May next succeeding the April 15th or the 15th day of November next succeeding the October 15th, as the case may be, next following the date of the bonds.

The following interest payments shall each be for six months interest and shall be payable on each fifteenth day of May and November, the last interest payment coming due forty-five (45) days before the last annual payment of the principal.

The bonds shall bear interest at a rate to be determined on the sale thereof of provided, however, that said rate shall not exceed the maximum rate of six (6) percent per annum.
