



W. B. Jameson Promoted at Bethlehem Co.

W. B. Jameson, assistant works manager of Bethlehem Steel Company's fabricating works in Torrance, has been named works manager. He succeeds Fred C. Todd, Jr., who retired after 40 years of service.

The announcement was made effective July 1, 1959, by W. J. McClung, general manager of operations for the company's Pacific Coast Division.

A native of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, Jameson earned a degree in civil engineering at Swarthmore College, Pennsylvania. His college career was interrupted by service in the United States Navy.

After graduation in 1949, Jameson entered the company's Loop Course, an intensive indoctrination and training program conducted for college graduates. During this training program, Jameson spent time in various departments of the company's Pottstown, Pennsylvania, fabricating works.

In 1951 he served as field engineer on the four-mile-long Chesapeake Bay Bridge. Upon completion of the bridge and following nine months as assistant foreman, structural steel fabricating works in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, he was assigned in June, 1954 as project engineer for Bethlehem's new fabricating works in Torrance. He was appointed assistant works manager of the works in January, 1957.

Jameson is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, American Welding Society, Sigma Xi, National Scientific Honorary, and Sigma Tau National Engineering Honor.

He resides with his wife and three children in Palos Verdes Estates.

Firemen Plan New Strategy

A new law will be used by the Torrance firemen's union to deal directly with the City Council on salary and grievances it was announced this week.

Jerry Hollomon, legislative chairman of Local 1138, said that Assembly Bill 618, which goes into effect Sept. 19, recognizes the right of firemen to organize into unions and to deal directly with the City Council.

He said that in the past grievances were referred to the Civil Service Commission and City Manager George Stevens and that the union was not recognized as a bargaining agent.

Hollomon asserted that the firemen will now deal with the Civil Service Commission in the future unless the City Council gives it more power.

"The Council won't let the commission make any important decisions," Hollomon claimed.

He said that one of the grievances which will be taken up will be his own charge that he was bypassed in a promotional examination.

Hollomon and Dick De Armit, president of the Torrance local, said that they learned at a legislative briefing by the Fire Fighters Union that they will have all the rights of other labor unions except to strike or refuse picket lines when on duty.
