Teacher to Leave for Assignment in Japan

At least two members of a Hollywood Riviera family expect to do some teaching in Japan shortly, but only one will be paid for it. William King Sawers, 38, an English-Social Studies teacher, will give instruction in a Japanese high school in Yokohama, for the next year or two. His son, Jeffrey, 6, who attended Riviera School last year, expects to give fellow students in Japan lessons in baseball. The Sawers, of 4814 Via El Seno, will leave for Seattle tomorrow and take a ship for Japan from there. Sawers, who has been attending a language seminar at the University of Michigan for the past six weeks on a Fullbright scholarship, returned here yesterday. Mrs. Sawers, a member of the cast of the recent production of "Guys and Dolls," finds the prospect of the trip a particular thrilling one. "I've never been out of California before," she said. Her husband is a teacher in a Venice junior high and applied for the foreign assignment in order to advance his knowledge of other people's culture and their teaching methods. Although he has been given a concentrated language course, Sawers will be helped in his classroom duties by an interpreter. Jeffrey will attend a Japanese elementary school where he is not

expected to have too much difficulty since they teach English along with Japanese. His younger brother, Nicholas, 2 1/2, will also go along on the trip. "What really tickles me," said Mrs. Sawers, "is that I have some clothes that were originally imported from Japan. Now I'm going to take them back where they came from."


