
Homemade refreshments were donated by the following mothers, Mmes. Robert Clark, William Fraser, William Carter and Mardi Sharp.

A three hour drive and a one mile hike marked D-Day for Boy Scout Troop 732.


Camp Pepperdine, the objective of the boys, was captured for the week with hiking, fishing and boat riding at the Lake Arrowhead site the victor's reward.
