





## G. P. Refinery Sets Low Smog Rating Standard

The anti-smog rating of gasoline lines sold in the Los Angeles Basin during the month of July was released by the Air Pollution Control District today.

Based upon the olefin content of the gasoline, as measured in terms of "Bromine Number," the District rated 49 brands and grades from 23 different refiners. Of these, the report stated, 22 tested out at a Bromine Number of 30 or less and thus satisfied the requirements of Rule 63, which becomes effective July 1, 1960. After that date all gasoline sold in the Basin must meet this standard.

Newhall Refining Company continued in first place with its regular grade of gasoline showing only a 1.3 Bromine, while the same company's premium grade was third with a Bromine of 9.1. Century Oil Company's premium was second at 7.2.

Significant changes were registered by two major companies, Texaco and Standard. Texaco for the first time moved a gasoline into the below 30 group, with its premium changing from 34.3 in 38th place in June to 21.9 in 13th place for July. Standard changed its middle grade from last month's 40.6 Bromine, which had it in 44th place, to 30.5 which put it in 24th place.

Standard missed only by a fraction in bringing its middle grade below 30, which would have made it the only company having three grades in the approved class. Standard's regular and custom grades are below Bromine Number 20, which is a level that will not be compulsory until January 1, 1962.

Two major refiners, General Petroleum and Tidewater, each of which market two grades of gasoline, had both grades below Bromine Number 30. Of companies other than Standard marketing three grades, Powerline and Wilshire also had two grades below 30.

## Approve Street Work Petitions

Approval to circulate a petition for the proposed improvement of Delford and Kinard Avenues in Torrance was announced today by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

As adopted by the Board of Supervisors, the order authorizes residents to circulate a petition for the formation of a special assessment district.

Before the Board can take any further action, however, Chace said, the petition must be signed by owners of 60 per cent of the assessable area of property in the proposed district and be returned to the Board by August 1, 1960.

## Big Stake in M.S. Fight Seen for Businessmen

"Business and industry have a big stake in the fight against multiple sclerosis, which is disabling thousands of our young men and women in their most productive years," declared Willis W. Atkinson, commerce and industry chairman of the multiple sclerosis fund-raising drive, being conducted this month by the Southern California chapter of the National MS Society.

There are an estimated 500,000 cases of multiple sclerosis and central nervous system in Southern California, and approximately 500,000 in the United States, Atkinson said.

"This represents 0.8 percent of the total working force of our nation, and 1.25 percent in the principal age group affected," he pointed out. "MS strikes chiefly young men and women of 20 to 40 years—the mainstay of our economy. These are the young adults who build the strength of our industry and the business life of our communities."

"In this sense, the funds donated to the 'MS Chest' are an investment in the future of our economic structure," Atkinson stated.
