

### Nurses Save City Money in Stopping Malingerers, Claim

Several cities who use a personnel nurse find that this cuts down on sick leave time, a report from City Manager George Stevens showed this week. He made the report after Councilman Nickolas O. Drale balked at hiring a nurse to make home calls on sick employees in the form of a "snooper."

Stevens said that the personnel nurse system has worked out well in Glendale, Pasadena, San Jose and Berkeley. In addition, several other cities use department supervisors and assistants to make home calls on ailing employees.

The city manager pointed out that in no case would the person enter a home unless admitted voluntarily. But if admission


### Kiwanis Club to Take Orphans on Disneyland Trip

Fairy tales will come true for 30 children Wednesday when the El Camino Kiwanis Club will wave a magic wand and transport them all to Disneyland. Crocodiles, Indians, savage Africans, moon rockets, river steamboats, Frontier land, Tomorrowland, and Fantasyland all merged into one glorious day for these children whose own tomorrowland is so very much in doubt.

Joe Jeffers, president of El Camino Kiwanis, puts it this way: "While people are fighting to get ordinary white children, the county has many minority children who have to wait and wait

for parents. We wanted to give these youngsters one big day and also let people see what wonderful kids they are. Surely, when it's known that children like these can be adopted, they will no longer be homeless."

Little waiting is required for people who want to adopt these children and others of Negro, Mexican, Indian and Oriental backgrounds. Requirements for adoption are described as simple. Most important is a love for children and a happy home life. Money in the bank and high wages are not required. There is a modest fee charged for those who can pay but this is not charged if it would make it difficult for the family. A phone call to DU 8-0471, the County Bureau of Adoption, starts the whole adoption process.


