

Annual Cocktail Party Announced by Temple

Temple Menorah began in the early part of 1946, when a small group met in Hermosa Beach in the home of Anna and the late Isaac H. Grancell. Shortly thereafter, through the generosity of the Grancells, the old Odd Fellows hall was purchased and remodeled for use as a "Jewish Community Center" and Temple.

Early the next year, a Sisterhood was instituted and through hardworking group of ladies, the Temple grew and increased in members and in service. Since that date instruction has been

given over two hundred children each year in the Religious School which meets four times weekly. Two youth groups exist to fill the social, religious and cultural needs of teen-agers from twelve years of age and older; a Men's Club has been created for the men of the congregation. Religious services and other Temple functions, such as personal counseling, are under the direction of the spiritual leader, Rabbi Henri Front.

A new Temple building is about to be erected near the intersection of Prospect and Sepulveda, in Redondo Beach. Money has already been pledged and construction will begin in the very near future.

Adventist to Attend Home for Aged Opening

Members of Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church will mark the opening of a locally-sponsored, ultra-modern \$750,000, home for senior citizens in Ventura County's Sonejo Valley, Sunday.

The local Adventist church is one of 78 sponsoring churches in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties of the home for senior citizens.

Situated on a 20-acre site near Thousand Oaks the new facility is located midway between Los Angeles and Ventura on Highway 101.

Seven buildings housing ten guests each, lounges, kitchenettes, hobby and sewing rooms, laundries, resident staff building, infirmary, and administration building which include lounge, chapel, central dining room, kitchen, and employes dining room comprise the facility.

Master plan for the institution calls for future addition of four 10-unit guest buildings as well as 25 bungalow or duplex units as needed.

The first institution of its kind built by Adventist in Southern California, Rancho Ventura Estates will provide the most modern facilities for elderly citizens in this area, Pastor Goffar said.

Pastor Goffar said member of his church expect to be present at opening ceremonies of the institution at 2:30 p.m., Sunday.
