er. But the Depression of 1930 bankrupted Reid, and no interest was ever paid on the loan.

Although under the original deed, each lot owner could have been assessed as much as \$10 per month for the club operation, no home owner ever was asked to pay anything, Hanson explained.

He said that each of 2500 individual lot owners have a share in the club house which burned down almost a year ago. Cause of the fire has never been officially determined.

The present owners want to clear title to the land for future development through the auction to be held at 433 S. Spring St., Los Angeles.

Marine Captain Sharpshoots Himself to Navy Trophy

Using an M-1 service rifle instead of aerial guns, Marine Reserve Captain Kenneth J. Erdman, of Torrance, California, shot his way to the National Reserve Service Rifle Championship and captured the Navy Cup, both in the same day at the 1959 National Rifle Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio.

The aviator-marksman fired a potent 489 points with 47 shots

in the tiny V-ring (dead center of the bullseye) in the five matches that make up the Service Rifle Championship to outshoot all other military reservists firing in the 1959 world series of shooting.

In the Navy Cup Match, Captain Erdman, fired a perfect 100 scores with nine shots in the V-ring to outshoot some 2,200 of the nation's top riflemen, regular military, reservists and civilian,

to keep the coveted trophy in the Navy Family.

The 27-year old Reserve Captain is a flight test engineer in the Los Angeles region of the Federal Aviation Agency. He left the Marine Corps regular service last year after a four-year tour that included service both as a jet and a transport pilot.

Captain Erdman was a member of the United States International Rifle Team in 1957. He lives with his wife, Karen, at 1900 W. Artesia Blvd.


