

Ryan Company to List Shares on New York Stock Exchange

Ryan Aeronautical Company, with manufacturing and research facilities in both Torrance and San Diego, Tuesday listed its shares for trading on the New York Stock Exchange.

One of America's pioneer aircraft and aeronautical equipment manufacturers, Ryan will be known on the trading floor by the symbol "RYC."

The listing ceremony at the start of trading was attended by Robert C. Jackson, executive vice president and vice chairman of the board of the San Diego aircraft firm, and G. Keith Funston, president of the stock exchange.

A total of 1,721,662 Ryan shares are being listed on the New York Stock Exchange, including 88,845 shares reserved for option.

Since incorporation 28 years ago, Ryan has been engaged primarily in design, development, manufacture and sale of aircraft and aeronautical products as a prime contractor to the military services and as both a contractor and subcontractor of components for other companies in the aircraft industry.

Major areas of current operation are aircraft and missiles, electronics and power plant components.

Ryan's modern facilities include a new electronics division with well over one-third of a million square feet of floor space at the Torrance and Kearny Mesa industrial area of San Diego, in addition to over 1,100,000 square feet at its main San Diego aircraft plant.

Present payroll is in excess of 76000 employees.

Five youths were trapped this week on the rocky Palos Verdes coastline and were rescued by Coast Guardsmen from high waves.

Marooned near Marineland for two hours Sunday night were Robert E. Clements, 19, and his brother Homer, 11, of 23417 Carkskill Ave., Harbor City.

The boys were brought to shore by men from the Point Vincente Station, who swam to the rocks with a rubber life raft. The brothers said they became stranded when the high tide rolled in.
