### Award Contract for New \$456,983 Building at El Camino College

To help meet the needs of El Camino's ever-growing student population, the contract for the Humanities Building was awarded this week, Carl G. Arfwedson, director of business, announced today.

The two-story reinforced concrete and brick building will be erected in the parking space west of the Campus Theater.

The Humanities Building will provide twenty additional classrooms, space for 60 offices, a staff conference room and an office for the assistant director of humanities, Harry L. Ruby.

#### Low Bidder

"The low bid of \$456,983.00, made by Secrest and Fish, Inc., of Whittier, represents an average of \$14.05 per square foot. This is a very low bid for this type of construction," Arfwedson said.

Student and faculty parking space west of the campus theatre has already been replaced by the

new parking lot adjacent to the new Technical Arts Building on Manhattan Beach Blvd.

Beautiful as well as functional, the Humanities Building will be the contemporary - modern design of the other buildings on the campus, Arfwedson explained.

Final working drawings for additions to the Campus Center are now in the hands of the architects. When completed they will be sent to the State Division of Architecture for approval. Construction will begin following the State's approval and the advertisement and acceptance of bids. Completion in One Year.

"We hope to be under-

soon so that the building's additions can be completed and occupied a year from now," Arfwedson stated.

This will provide offices for student activities personnel which are now being housed in the Administration Building. Plans include a new student store, a large study room and student lounge.

Additions to the chemistry and physics buildings are expected to be completed and fully occupied by Oct. 1. This construction is also being handled by Secrest and Fish.

Future plans include additions to the Technical Arts Building and the eventual removal of all the temporary buildings. This space, on Redondo Beach Blvd., will be converted into a large parking lot.
