Local Commerce and Industry Chest Aides Meet at Luncheon

High spot of the Community Chest's commerce and industry campaign last week was an employee chest chairmen lunch at the Plush Horse, Pacific Coast Highway.

Attending as guests of business firms supporting the campaign were employee chest chairmen of the Harbor area.

The Chest chairmen, appointed by the firms, organize contributions from fellow workers.

Speakers at the luncheon stressed importance of the "Eight Minutes a Week" pay deduction. This is the standard that business and labor leaders have agreed upon as representing fair giving for hourly rated employees. Eight minutes a week represents 3 per cent of earnings.

To make their efforts effective, employee chairmen were urged to get the boss to help.

Chief executives at each firm with an employee Chest chairman are being asked to help in four ways:

1. To write a letter to each employee endorsing the campaign.
2. To arrange for a voluntary payroll plan.
3. To approve company time for solicitor training, employee rallies, and solicitation.
4. To state their approval of the campaign plan at a meeting of department heads.

Speakers, films, literature and posters have been made available to all employee chairmen. If the required percentage of employees and executive in any one firm pledge on the standard of eight minutes a week, they and the employee chairman may win the Chest award for outstanding citizenship.

A former professor of history at the University of Wyoming and a specialist in international relations, McGee will discuss "Uncle Sam's Current Problems."


