**Civic Center Group Headed by Becker**

James P. Becker, civic leader, was elected chairman of the Civic Center Promotion Committee at the group's first meeting at City Hall.

The committee appointed by City Councilman and comprising 12 members, will attempt to make recommendations to the council concerning development of the Civic Center.

According to July 28 resolution by the council, the group is entrusted to make recommendations to the council on the (1) preparation of a master plan of development, (2) determination of a schedule for development, (3) selection of financing, (4) hiring experts and consultants, and (5) other related matters it deems necessary or proper.

City Manager George Stevens said the group will next meet at 7:45 p.m. Monday, Oct. 20, at City Hall, and thereafter on the second and fourth Monday of each month.

Becker said he is certain the group will not be in conflict with city commissions that might be involved. "We only wish to cooperate with everyone concerned so that this beautiful Civic Center may be properly developed as quickly as possible to the benefit of all our citizens," Becker added.

Becker, first chairman of the group, is local manager of the Southern California Gas Company, and, since being transferred to Torrance two years ago, has developed into one of the community's most dedicated leaders. He is Harbor area chairman of the Community Chest, a director of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, president of the Dental Health Association, director of the Harbor Area Welfare Federation, director of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce, and a member of the Torrance Lions Club and the Executives' Dinner Club of the Torrance area. He was just appointed by the City Council as the city's 14th member on the Inter-City Highway Committee.
