## Torrance-Konya Committee Plans Turkey Celebration

The Torrance City-to-City Committee Monday night set machinery in motion for observance of Konya Days next February. The machinery admittedly is in low gear, after the majority of numerous committee-chairman reports were referred to the executive board for study and action.

The group, responsible for relationships between Torrance and Konya, Turkey—the sister city—appealed for a catch phrase, a gimmick, a slogan, to typify the 1959-60 program. The phrase would serve to implement the group's "Visit Turkey" theme.

The committee last year traveled a rocky road in getting its program with Konya under way. Trying to promote cordiality at a distance of thousands of miles, with a language barrier, and with global suspicion of American motives, is not a simple task. Konya wouldn't recognize Torrance for three months after the overture.

Charles Deck, student-exchange chairman, reported that some 120 boys taking English in Konya want to correspond with a like number of girls here. It has been suggested from many quarters that the committee sponsor an exchange student from Konya.

The first agency to be approached was the American Field Service, it was reported by Beverly Fossum, historian, but it turned out that facility will not guarantee a specific student for a certain city. The committee finally generally agreed to forget about the field service and proceed on its own. The only item unresolved was where the \$750 cost is going to come from.

Much discussion centered round the language barrier, and it pleased the committee to know the Turks are learning English. At no juncture was it suggested that anyone learn Turkish.

Naomi McVey, committee chairman for Konya Days told of efforts to present high functionaries from Turkey and has arranged for costumes, dances, and exhibits from that country.

She also extended an invitation from the Turkish-American committee in Los Angeles to attend its annual banquet Nov. 8 at the Moulin Rouge.

The Torrance committee wants to send gifts to individuals in Turkey, but learned the duty is so enormous it exceeds the value of the article. This led to a discussion of the practicability of sending some of our more innocuous magazines, but it was not known whether or not these could be sent duty-free to a specific recipient.

The Junior Woman's Club already is sending discarded magazines and carrying on correspondence with people of Konya, the group was told.

The enormous task the City-to-City Committee has carved for itself will require prodigious effort to carry through. The group can use all the help available in the form of new members and backing by other groups and individuals.

The people who compose the committee spend their own money and time and are not compensated except by the satisfaction in what they achieve.

The people of Konya, while still skeptical are considerably more hospitable than they were. The U.S. national committee has warned that it takes some cities months to break the barriers of suspicion and indecision.

Although the results of international friendship are incalculable, the committee is doing a good unselfish job of putting Torrance on the global map through its endeavors.
