### Nest of Black Widows Inspires Pupils to Start Spider Museum

Discovery of black-widow spiders at Hillside School brought up spray guns and stirred interest in setting up a science museum in a third and fourth-grade classroom.

Geneva Campbell's students decided to study spiders and set up a museum.

The youngsters discovered that black widows are the only poisonous spiders in this area. Others kill harmful insects. The black widow, the class found, has a potent bite which usually makes its victim sick.

This discovery led the children to catch several of the friendly spiders and display them in bottles in a museum. The youngsters wrote papers about them and drew pictures of them.

They named some of the spiders and were quite upset when George ate Larry.

Also included in the museum are a couple of lizards caught by class members, and various bugs.

"The children are not afraid of spiders now. They know more about them than most adults," said Mrs. Campbell.




