2000 MORE PUPILS PREDICTED FOR '60

Enrollment in Torrance schools is expected to increase about 2000 again next year, it was reported to the Board of Education.

Officials expect 26,850 students in 1960-61, of which 21,300 would be in elementary school and 5550 in high school. Estimates indicate that there will be about 3100 kindergartners next fall. About 1000 seniors will graduate from high school this spring.

The 1960-61 fifth and 10th-grades are expected to be smaller than those this year. Other classes more than make up for that decline.

Enrollment has been increasing by about 2000 a year for the past three years. Some 14,000 are under five years old.

500 Students to Be Freed to Take Christmas Jobs

About 500 high-school students will be released a week before Christmas to take jobs, the Board of Education decided Tuesday night.

Students who get selling jobs will be required to take a one-week course in salesmanship during the week of Nov. 23-27.

Lecturers from leading firms will appear at the after-school sessions to explain what is expected of the students.

Opening of the Del Amo and South Bay shopping centers in

this area will mean many more job openings for students, according to Lysle Albro, work-experience coordinator.

Last year about half of Torrance's students had Christmas jobs in Crenshaw department stores.

A study indicated that 90 per cent of the employers were pleased with the students' work.

The salesmanship course will deal with customers, sales slips, personal appearance, and other subjects.

Group Discusses Transition from Grammar School

Transition from elementary to high school work was discussed Thursday by South High School officials and principals of the 11 elementary schools, whose students will attend South High.

Plans were made to send demonstration teams of students from South High to the elementary schools, exchange teachers to compare problems of educating children at the different levels, and other techniques.

The group, headed by Willard Morgan, assistant principal, also discussed summer school, talented students programing, and other subjects.




