Chapel, termed the poor man's Republican by the kindest of his critics. He gets a \$230 monthly pension from the marine corps because of a wound in his leg, which also was afflicted by polio, so he never is sure what ails him. A successful author, he has 23 books on the market. He is an aeronautical engineer and doesn't need his legislator's job to live. He happened into politics by chance when a candidate disgraced himself, leaving the party with no one to put up. At the last minute Chapel went into the race and won.

He declared most Republicans are a bunch of stuffed shirts who make speeches as if they were delivering an academic address rather than talking to people. He has rectified that to a degree, for few in a call a spade a damn shovel, like Charlie Chapel. He told the gathering that all so-called fact-finding committees are rigged and loaded, and if they are not, their proponents ought to have their heads looked into.

His principal reason for becoming a member of the Legislature was to do something about UCLA, where his daughter was expelled to buy a book written by one of her instructors.

To say Chapel held the book in light esteem would be to accuse him of enthusiasm; he carried on a campaign over it, second only to one against major oil companies. The latter was nurtured by attachment of his car when his gas bill ran over.

The notion on the part of politicians that they are selected by destiny is so much hogwash, he declared; in most cases it is pure chance.

Although the Republican party has come to be a tool of big business, Chapel affirmed that it should continue to be what it was originally: a group promoting the interests of small business, workers, and farmers.

The question of the effect of lobbyists and letters on politicians brought divergent replies. Isen, who was forced to excuse himself to take care of city business before conclusion of the meeting, declared that local lobbyists are civic rather than political. They are citizens, rather than lobbyists, but when they jam a council session, they have a profound effect on the decisions of the body.

Isen said an abusive letter from a crackpot can upset him for days.

Thomas said lobbyists are necessary to acquaint the legislator with all facets of an issue. Without them, it would be impossible to obtain facts for a judicious vote. He said lobbies of such groups as churches, labor, chambers of commerce, business groups, and unions should keep the lawmaker informed both of facts and the wishes of their employers.

He discounts mass mailings, postal cards all bearing the same message, and letters obviously all sent at behest of a pressure group. What he wants is a handwritten letter; he can be reasonably sure it is sincere.

Chapel prefers typewritten letters.

Delta Zetas Will Hear Garden Talk

Wally Fraser will speak on "Foliage Plants for the Modern Garden," before a meeting of the South Bay chapter of Delta Zeta, Wednesday at the home of Mrs. Norman DeWitt, Hawthorne.

Mr. Fraser, representative of the Inglewood Nursery, will accompany his talk with color slides illustrating various possibilities in landscaping.

Following the speaker, plans will be discussed for the chapter's benefit fashion show, "Flame and Fantasy," Feb. 6, at the Beverly Hilton. Mrs. Jack C. Whippis of Torrance will be committee member representing the South Bay area. Proceeds will benefit the Uni-Betic camp for diabetic children.

As to pressures from the political parties, Thomas said that prior to 1950 there was little unity and little influence. But after abolition of cross-filing influence became more solid. He said a consensus of the party's thinking is arrived at in weekly caucuses, and the legislator may be guided by these decisions although they are not mandatory.

Chapel described pressures put on him during the so-called "right to work" battle. Both sides offered him money to take a stand. Chapel said the measure would wreck the Republican party and Sen. William F. Knowland, and it did.

When the so-called oil-conservation measure was being considered for a ballot, he bought an edition of a newspaper and went all-out to kill the initiative. When big business threatened to abstain from donating to his campaigns, he wondered what difference it would make: they never had supported him.

Asked about influence of their wives, Thomas declared his wife sits in the back of the legislature chamber and offers an opinion only after the vote is cast. He said Mrs. Thomas assists him in keeping a scrap book up to date on issues and the thinking of proponents and opponents.

Chapel said that, with the exception of urging equal pay for women's equal work, his wife keeps her nose out of his affairs. "I don't want anyone banging my ear about politics in the boudoir," he said with finality.

He noted she did try to get him to cease cussing in public, but it is dubious this can be accomplished by anybody or anything but chloroform.

The lawmakers discussed patronage, its virtues and vices, and gave a more complete insight into the workings of politics than any of the auditors had experienced. They discussed reapportionment, influence, political organizations, and vote-getting.

Chairman Holmes finally concluded the meeting by describing appearance of the politicians as the frosting on the cake of their classes.
