Saxons Drop Final, 12-7, to Inglewood

Continuing in their losing way the hapless Saxons from North High dropped their sixth loss of the season to Inglewood High at the latter's field Friday night.

Holding a stubborn Inglewood team to just six points in the first three quarters North appeared to be on the road to their second win. However, with just four minutes remaining in the game Bob Guvara scampered 50 yards to thrill the home crowd with the score that won the game for the Sentinels.

North drew first blood in the contest. In the second period John McCall carried for six and Rick Jacobs converted sending the Saxons ahead 7-0 as the half ended.

The game was a close affair throughout most of the contest and witnessed the Saxons playing better ball than they have been for the past few weeks. It was not enough however.

Inglewood was determined to win from the onset in order to keep from dipping under the .500 mark for the year. North, by virtue of their defeat dropped to the cellar of the Bay League.

The Tartars blasted Culver City Friday night before 3000, 25-6, as Pete Mitchell and Joe Montgomery combined their talents to lead Torrance High to their fifth win to close out the 1959 season. A near riot developed towards the end of the game as both benches were emptied when a fight started on the field. Police had to be called when the fans left their seats and joined in the mele.

After taking the opening kickoff the Tartars drove 56 yards in six plays for their first score. Mitchell and Montgomery alternating and plowing through center, tackle, and guard to set up Stewart's plunge for the touchdown from the 3 yard line. Before the first period ended the

same duo led the Tartars to another score. This time for 69 yards in 12 plays with Mitchell taking the ball over from the four.

Mitchell, out of action during most of the season, carried the final nine yards for Torrance's third touchdown of the first half to culminate an 81 yard drive.

In the third period the Tartars held up their own chances for a near rout as they fumbled four times. However, in the final period Wisham blocked a Culver City punt and Frank Tuttle recovered on the Centaur's 15. "Monk" drove through tackle on the next play for all the yardage and the TD.

The near-riot began after Culver City scored its only touchdown. Campbell intercepted a Dobrick pass and went 26 yards for the score. The hand-to-hand

combat ensued when players piled on after the try for the extra point was muffed.
