Hahn Requests Representative on State PUC

Southern California, which has 65 per cent of California's population, has no representation on the state Public Utilities Commission, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn declared today as the Board of Supervisors, on his motion, urged Gov. Brown to consider the problem and provide representation on the commission for Southern California.

Hahn said all members live in or near the San Francisco area. He said the commission is not required to hold hearings in the communities affected by hikes in rates for gas, water, telephones, transportation, and other utility services.

His motion also urged Brown to request the commission to hold full hearings in Los Angeles when the people were to be affected by utility rate increases.

Study of Habits Relating to Cancer Scheduled Here

More than 32,000 Los Angeles County families will participate in the largest health study ever attempted, it was announced today by the county branch of the American Cancer Society.

Dr. H. Russell Fisher, chairman of the health habits study committee, said the local families have not yet been chosen. They will be selected by a group of 5000 volunteer researchers, each of whom will keep track of 10 families during the next six years.

The study is part of a nationwide survey to shed more light on the reasons why some persons get cancer and others do not.

"In simple terms, it is a study of the relationship of human living habits to cancer," Dr. Fisher explained. "The occurrence of cancer will be correlated with such factors as heredity, environment, diet, occupational influences, standards of living, and air pollution," he said.

Across the nation, 500,000 families will be asked to fill out questionnaires.

The study will be conducted in the Centinela-South Bay District with the following volunteers as unit leaders: Mrs. James Robert Black, Beach cities unit leader, Hermosa Beach (El Segundo, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach); Mrs. Claude N. Monson, Centinela Valley unit leader, Inglewood (Hawthorne, Lawndale, Lennox, Playa del Rey, Westchester); Mrs. Robert Stapleton, Peninsula unit leader, Redondo Beach (Palos Verdes Estates, Portuguese Bend, Rolling Hills); Mrs. James Moses, Torrance-Gardena unit leader, Gardena (Gardena, Harbor City, Hollywood Riviera, Lomita, Torrance, Walteria).

Distribution of questionnaires will begin Jan. 4 and will be completed during a two-week period. Families to be polled must include one member over 45, and only adults over 30 will fill out questionnaires.

Torrance Group Commends Hahn on Flood Control

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn this week was commended by the North Torrance Civic Improvement Association for his "untiring efforts in obtaining improvements" in the area, particularly improvement of Dominguez channel.

In a letter to the supervisor, Margaret H. Clark, president, North Torrance Civic Improvement Association, said the improvement of the channel between Gramercy Place and Redondo Beach Blvd. not only will benefit this area by eliminating floods, but will do away with an unsightly eyesore and hazard to the life and health of children.

She pointed out that the channel is being widened, deepened, the sides and bottom lined with reinforced concrete, and the channel right-of-way fenced.

Hahn said the project is the third in a series of improvements to the channel, and plans are being drawn for improvement and widening of the channel from Redondo Beach Blvd. to Compton Blvd.
