### Retail Sales Up for Dodge

Retail sales of Dodge and Dodge Dart passenger cars in the first ten days of December were 135.5 percent higher, 2 1/3 times greater than sales in the same 10-day period a year ago, M. C. Patterson, Chrysler Corporation vice president and general manager of the Dodge Division, announced today.

For the two-month period since introduction of the 1960 models on Oct. 9, sales were up 78.9 percent over the same period in 1959, Patterson said.

In the first 10 days of December, 1959, a total of 7632 cars were sold, compared with 3241 in December of 1958.

A total of 44,655 cars were sold during the two-month period of 1959 since introduction day, compared with 24,955 for the same period last year.
