Harbor Junior College Sponsors Book Drive for Asian Students

Harbor area residents are being invited to join Harbor College students in a "Book for Asian Students" drive, now in progress on the campus.

The drive, to be continued through Feb. 5, is being sponsored by the college International Club under leadership of Stefan Lee, LAHC visa student from Korea, and Dr. David H. Dingilian, foreign student counselor and club sponsor.

Purpose of the drive is to supply books which may be used as teaching aids in Asia. Both paper backs and books with hard covers are needed, and they should be classics or

books published within the last 10 years. They may be deposited in boxes in the main lobby of the college administration building, in the library, and in the campus center.

"The International Club is made up of 23 students from 10 foreign countries who are very interested in world affairs and in the scientific and technological abundance which enables us to have such rich libraries," Dr. Dingilian said.

Census Office for Torrance Now Operating

Establishment of a district office for the 1960 census of population and housing at 353 East Queen St., Inglewood, was announced today by Director Leonard C. Isley of the Census Bureau's regional office at Los Angeles.

Robert S. Reese will be supervisor of the district office. He will direct a force of 43 crew members and 674 census takers in Torrance, Palos Verdes, Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Gardena, Hawthorne, El Segundo, Inglewood, and a small section of Los Angeles north of Inglewood.

Taking the 1960 census nationally will require the services of 160,000 enumerators, 10,000 crew leaders and 400 district supervisors, all temporary workers. The district supervisors, working under the general direction of the permanent regional field directors, are responsible for all phases of the census in their districts. Duties of the district supervisor include the recruiting of crew leaders, obtaining space for crew leader training, recruiting and training a small office staff, reviewing the completed questionnaires and direct supervision of the field canvass, which begins April 1.

Prior to the start of the census, all households will receive in the mail an Advance Census Report Form, a new census-taking device which is designed to speed up the field canvass and provide more accurate statistics. Distribution of this form, which contains the basic population and housing questions, gives the family a chance to assemble information about each member in advance of the census taker's visit.
