National Supply, Employees Give \$2400 to Red Cross

The National Supply Co. and its employees have contributed more than \$2400 to the Red Cross, it was announced this week by J. Arthur Taylor, commerce-and-industry fund chairman.

"Some 650 employees gave \$825," said Taylor, "in addition to their firm's contribution of \$1600."

Homer Schooley, chairman of National Supply Employees Club, said that the employees' group gives \$11,000 annually to 20 charities in this area. "The pro-

gram has been in existence 10 years," he added, "and has the participation of about 80% of our employees."

Taylor, vice-chairman of the board of the First Western Bank and Trust Co. in Los Angeles, said the National Supply contributions represent one of major gifts by local industry to services of the Red Cross.

The 1960 fund campaign will be held in March.




