Surfriders Building 74-Home Tract for Pageant Realty Co.

A vast new tract of 74 homes is taking shape on 230th St. between Arlington and Walnut. Sales are being handled by Pageant Realty, management of which disclosed features of the homes yesterday.

The units, being constructed on several different elevations, will feature three basic floor plans. They will comprise three bedrooms and family room or four bedrooms and a bath and three-quarters.

Fireplaces and forced-air heat are included. Many will be fitted with carpeting before occupancy. Other features include tile and formica sink and cabinet tops, garbage disposers, hard-wood floors, and natural-wood cabinets.

The homes are being wired for 220-volt current for dish washers and clothes dryers. Double gar-

ages are provided in each home. All improvements are in.

Pageant said the houses will be ready for occupancy in two to three months. Called Cabrillo-Wood, the tract is being built by Surfriders Development Inc. of Lomita.



New Plastic Division Being Built by Horkey-Moore Here

Formation of a plastics division as a new unit of Horkey-Moore Associates was announced today by Edward J. Horkey, president.

The division will be devoted to application and extension of reinforced plastics to missiles, aircraft and space vehicles, as well as commercial and industrial products. Horkey said its inception is a part of a continuing program to key all Horkey-Moore facilities to the expanding requirements of the space and missile age.

The plastics division will undertake fabrication of reinforced plastics structures capable of withstanding very high temperatures. Modern missiles, aircraft and space vehicles are encountering temperatures of more than 1000 degrees F., at which no known solid is stable. Space progress depends upon structures which can withstand

high temperatures for extended periods of time, Horkey said. The new division will be headed by Carl S. Seybold, who has joined Horkey-Moore as plastics division manager. Seybold's background includes many years of experience in application and design of reinforced plastics. He was formerly associated with E. I. DuPont de Nemours Co. and North American Aviation as well as other firms. As a recognized authority in the plastics industry, he has also served on the staff at UCLA and as consultant to major organizations in the nation.

Vincent G. Gurley was appointed assistant manager. He is well-known for his work in quality control of reinforced plastics fabrication and processing. He was associated with Paul Omohundro Co. as manager of contract engineering and quality control and process engineering before joining Horkey-Moore.


The plastics division will be housed in a 6000-square-foot engineering and factory building, under construction adjacent to the main Torrance facilities. Equipment to be installed will permit fabrication of high-temperature and high-pressure-resistant plastic components of very large size.

Plastics-division employment is scheduled to reach 100 by end of the year. The Horkey-Moore staff now numbers 250, of whom 40 per cent are engineering and technical personnel.
