State taxes on November wholesale distributions of alcoholic beverages totaled \$4,886,816. This is an increase of 17.7% over 1958.

The state tax took \$4,189,634. Distributions of distilled spirits was 2,793,000 gallons, an increase of 10.4% above 1958 and the second largest November distribution since repeal.
