

Woman's Club to Be Entertained by Folk Singer



Gray Ladies Needed at Harbor Hospital

The Red Cross is seeking volunteers to serve in its Gray Lady Service at Harbor General Hospital, according to Mrs. Wilson Patterson, Gray Lady chairman for the South Bay area. Mrs. Patterson explained that the Gray Lady Service had changed considerably since it was organized in 1918 to serve the sick and injured returning from the battlefields of World War I. "Then, their duties were to provide entertainment and serve as hostesses for the servicemen," she said. "Now, the Gray Lady performs personal service for the individual patient, and serves in civilian as well as veteran hospitals. "She does the patient's shopping for him, writes his letters, reads to him, brings him magazines, and assists him in arts and crafts." The chairman said that there is no age limit to become a Gray Lady. "She must be over 18 years of age, in good health, and have a pleasing personality," she said. "Above all, she must be able to converse comfortably with the disabled patient, be a good listener, and talk with him about his family and his interests." This week, at San Pedro Red Cross headquarters, 390 W. 7th St., Mrs. Patterson will interview volunteers from southern Los Angeles County to serve at Harbor General Hospital.
