CRITIC'S CHOICE

Nixon-Rockefeller Double Portrait Really Two-Faced

Stewart Alsop: "Nixon and Rockefeller. A Double Portrait." Doubleday and Company, Inc. Garden City, New York, 1960, 240 pp.

If John Gunther had written this book, it would have been titled "Inside Nixon and Rockefeller." This brief volume is what purports to be the inside story of the two leading candidates of the Republican party for nomination as President of the United States. Obviously written before Gov. Nelson Rockefeller's withdrawal from seeking the nomination, it is a study, supposedly exact, of the character of both the Governor of New York and of the Vice President of the United States, Richard M. Nixon.

Mr. Alsop, one of the two famous brothers well known to the readers of their nationally syndicated column emanating from the New York Herald Tribune, is at present the national affairs contributing editor of the Saturday Evening Post. In his "Foreword" he explains the purpose for the writing of this little volume: "not... the whole story of the career of either Nixon or Rockefeller... but those episodes in their lives which seem to me to tell something about them, to help in understanding the sort of men they are."

These opportunities are several: In Mr. Nixon's life there is the famous fund episode, where Mr. Alsop points out to us several heretofore unknown incidents and gives us great insight into the type of politician Mr. Nixon is; and in Gov. Rockefeller's political life, he points out the Rockefeller who was in both the Roosevelt and the Eisenhower administrations as a not-to-be-minor appointed official, to show the approach to power that the great philanthropist exhibits. Mr. Alsop also contrasts the young manhood and college days of both candidates, to prove that since "the boy is father to the man" we can gain insight into who these men really are today by listening to the testimony of their respective classmates who remember them the way they were in college.

Mr. Alsop states that he is not "for" either candidate, but that since it appears that one or the other will be their party's nominee, the reader should be advised by what Alsop has to report. He is right; he is not painting the most pretty picture of either one. Nixon is a clever debater, clever to the point of using his powers to achieve his ends; similarly, Rockefeller is so desirous of yes-men that he surrounds himself only with those who will follow his suggestions. At least this is the author's view.

This reviewer came away from this book with vacillating opinions. First, we can not trust the recollections of college classmates to give us any degree of

valuable insight, even though Mr. Alsop would lead us to believe that this is an accepted and accurate method. Second, we have no way of verifying Mr. Alsop's stories about the inside scoop concerning either Nixon's "secret millionaire's fund" or Rockefeller's methods of handling subordinates in the particular situations described, or in the other situations he describes. Third, while it might be a credit that Mr. Alsop leaves us with no clear "point of view" concerning either man, it is discouraging to read a book which gives us nothing but facts. There are no clear conclusions by the author, or specific statements to show that one or the other is less desirable as President, or that the strengths are counterbalanced or are overshadowed by the weaknesses of each individual. It is as if both fighters in a boxing match were knocked each other out; there still is no decision to tell us which is the better.

A reader interested in a clear understanding of either candidate therefore must read other works and biographies in order to test Mr. Alsop's views. Perhaps taken along with Mr. Mazo's biography of Nixon, for example, or added to other volumes on either man, Alsop's story would produce a well-rounded portrait. But as it stands, this volume is as much a two-faced portrait as it is a double portrait.

State Chamber Head to Speak at 1960 Banquet

James Mussatti, general manager of the California Chamber of Commerce, will be keynote speaker at the annual banquet of the Torrance chamber March 30 at the Statler-Hilton, it was announced today by James Becker, general chairman.
