

324 Torrance Pupils Enrolled in Classes for Handicapped

Some 324 Torrance children are enrolled in classes for the handicapped, according to a report to the Board of Education. Of these, 85 are enrolled in classes under the Southwest School Districts Cooperative program, in which seven districts cooperate to provide training for children with handicaps. The Southwest program provides for 254 students.

Some 239 children are enrolled in classes for the moderately mentally retarded. These are not part of the cooperative program. The number of Torrance children in the various categories of the cooperative program include severely mentally retarded, 34;

elementary deaf and hard of hearing, 14; elementary orthopedic and delicate (crippled by disease), 11; elementary blind, 5; elementary partly-sighted, 6; cerebral palsy, 5; itinerant blind and partly-sighted, 4; high-school blind and partly-sighted, 3; high-school orthopedic, 1; and neurologically handicapped (brain damage), 1.

Torrance provides schooling for blind, partly-sighted, and severely mentally retarded children, while Inglewood, Lennox, Hawthorne, Lawndale, Wiseburn, and the Centinela Valley Union High School District provide schools for other types of handicaps.
