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### Report Claims Educational TV Not Satisfactory

TV may be a great teaching tool of the future, but it has many bugs.

That was the gist of a preliminary report made recently to the Torrance Board of Education. Five schools have tried classroom television during the past year, using Los Angeles County programs.

Sets were used at Riviera and Casimir schools and at North, South, and Torrance high schools. Open-circuit TV tried here has not been too satisfactory because it fails to fit into the curriculum, the report declared.

### Police Department's Jackson Hails Backing of Car Club Associations by State Legislature

One of the final resolutions of the State Assembly before its adjournment, endorsing the entire program of the associations of car clubs, was received enthusiastically by Detective A. L. Jackson, police sponsor of Car Clubs Association here.

"This is timely for the Police Advisory Council for Car Clubs, because our seventh annual Youth Safety Run will be held June 27-29 this year and Sacramento will be northern terminus of the trip," said Jackson.

The run, which will have representation from 20 Southern California communities, will start and end at Azusa.

The resolution, commending the event as part of the PACCC's program "for promoting traffic safety and a sense of responsibility on the part of youthful drivers" was passed unanimously.

It was written by Assemblymen William S. Grant (R) of Long Beach, 70th District and Ernest R. Geddes (R) of Claremont, 49th District.

Co-sponsoring the 1960 Youth Safety Run with the PACCC will be service clubs, automobile dealers, the Macmillan Petroleum Corp., and the Wilshire Oil Co.

The PACCC was formed seven years ago by representatives of the juvenile and traffic divisions of Los Angeles County police departments.

"It was a way of coping with mutual problems and establishing closer relationships between youth groups and the police departments," said Jackson.

As a result, the program has resulted in a sharp reduction of juvenile traffic problems.
