OUTDOORS WITH MEL

Here and there.

While San Diego has taken over the headlines in the salt water scene several other spots show promise of good fishing. I spoke to Ronnie Harris who went to Catalina over the weekend and fished the far side of the island. The yellows were there and although they only landed 2, he said that the water was alive with fish. This is good news as the islands haven't produced the kind of fishing that they are capable of. The fish were on the move constantly and very few were hooked up at each stop. The Redondo Beach-Rocky Point Area is still producing well with a bad day now and then. The Redondo Barge is now operating nights on the weekends. Fishing has started to pick up and many of the fishermen have been getting baracuda regularly as well as some nice halibut. Small boat fishermen had a field day on halibut on the inside of the Redondo Breakwater and there were so many fish in the bay that it was like the old days. Remember that the limit on these fish is 2 per day if any size. Up and down the coast every landing reports good fishing with baracuda providing most of the thrills. Very few yellows being taken except at San Diego where they've finally broken loose. The catches are averaging about 600 per day and are being taken on both bait and jigs.

The fresh water scene is also good. Most of the reports are from the high country where the crowds have thinned down to the normal population with lots of fishing room.

North of Bishop—Best spots East Walker, Robinson Creek, and Buckeye Creek. Best baits have been worms and red salmon eggs with best results on lures favoring super duper, hep spinners, and flatfish. Silver lake reports good fishing with a 4 1/2 pounder taking top honors for the first week. Lots of limits from both Silver and June up to 3 pounds while an 8 pounder was the best from June. Lake Mary and Lake George are still closed due to ice but should open soon. The Owens River has been heavily fished but is producing well with many cutthroats landed along with rainbows.

Local fishing.

Big Bear—Probably the best trout fishing close to home. The lake is heavily stocked every week and is producing very fine fishing. The trout are up to 3 pounds in weight and are very live on the line. Best bait has been worms but many fish are being taken by trolling Dave Davis spinners with hot shots and flatfish behind. Lake Sherwood is providing good bass fishing for experienced fishermen. They are taking surface plugs with poppers doing best. Lead is good on bass and crappie with hellbenders and bombers best for bass and gogetters and spinner-worms best for crappie.

Now is the time to start teaching that youngster how to fish. The weather is perfect and there are lots of places to go. Last year I took my 3 year old on the Redondo barge and found it the ideal place to show him how to cast and fish. It's also a good spot to teach sportsmanship and conservation. Now I plan a trip to Hemet lake which is close to home and has fair trout fishing.

Reevas and 13 other passengers fished offshore Redondo waters for yellowtail, halibut, bonito and barracuda on the half-day outing.

Biggest part of ocean fishing off Redondo is done over Redondo Canyon, a submarine canyon which moves fish in about a half mile from shore in its strong current.

Three sportfisher boats and three fishing barges now operate daily from the Redondo landing. Boats offer either half-day or all-day trips for fishermen who get to the land from 6 to 7:30 a.m. or at 12:30 p.m.
