Unlimited Health Told in Bible, Scientist Says

Unlimited health and peace are proved to be practical possibilities in accord with Scriptural promise, when true Christianity is put into action, Theodore Wallach of Chicago, Ill., said here Tuesday, in a lecture at First Church of Christ Scientist, 1750 Manuel Ave.

Materialistic thinking alone obscures the fact of unlimited spiritual good available to humanity, he said. Remove materialism from thought and the presence of good is demonstrable according to spiritually scientific rules, he maintained.

Talking on the subject, "Christian Science: The Availability of Unlimited Good," Mr. Wallach declared there is a Biblical basis for Christian healing that can be tested "by accepted yardsticks of logic and proof."

Throughout the Bible, he said, "there runs like a golden thread the assurance that, God is good." Behind the Scriptural promises, he added, "lies a definite pattern of infinite wisdom and goodness."

He said God gives unlimited health, morals, intelligence, abundance, happiness and peace, and "every apparent lack of these things can be rectified... by a correct understanding of God's infinite goodness."




