



'Evil Genius' of Turkey Was Visitor Here

A visitor to Torrance under this city's People-to-People program this week leaped through a four-storey window and ended his career as interior minister and chief of police under Turkey's Premier Menderes.

He was Namik Gedik, who visited here and toured the city as a guest with other Turkish officials touring the United States last year.

Gedik was the first suicide after Menderes was overthrown by the army last week. He was called the "evil genius" and had a reputation for iron-fisted enforcement of the incumbents' laws.

Monet Works Arrive in L.A.

Preparations are in full swing today at the Los Angeles County Museum for installation of the collection of paintings, valued at more than \$6,000,000, by the French master Claude Monet which arrived in Los Angeles yesterday.

Comprising more than 100 landscapes, seascapes and river scenes by the famed artist, who has been called the grandfather of Impressionism, the exhibition titled "Claude Monet: Seasons and Moments" opens at the Los Angeles County Museum on June 14.
