### Treasure Hunt Game Planned by Library

Boys and girls who would like to join a vacation club and go treasure-hunting in the world of books are invited to contact any of the three branches of the County Library at 1345 Post Ave., 3614 174th St., and 126 Vista del Parque and enroll at once.

The treasure hunt will begin June 17. Anyone can join any time, the three branch librarians said, but the sooner they start the quicker they can fill their treasure chest with pieces of eight, and the more fun it will be.

The pieces of eight are circles of gilt paper that looks like gold coins and the treasure chest is a picture of an old pirate's trunk that might have been buried with a hidden fortune in it.

All that is required to join the club is to go to the library and sign the membership roll. As soon as each member has read and reported on one book, he is given a folder, with a secret map inside, on which four treasure trials have been marked.

The club member decides which trail he will follow. On one he will find hidden treasure in science, on another something new and exciting in poetry. One leads to new friends on the trail.

The fourth trail is the most mysterious. It is the trail of the young reader's own choice and might lead anywhere.

Printed near the map is a scroll of travel directions and below that is the Treasure Chest. Everytime a book is read, a gold coin is pasted on the chest.

Names of all members will go up on a big poster in the library.

Last year a total of 11,080 boys and girls joined the summer reading club at the County Library's ninety-three branches. ### Championship Sheriff Rodeo Will Be Held in L.A. Coliseum Aug. 21

Brisk advance ticket sales for the 1960 Sheriff's Rodeo were reported today by Montie Montana, general manager and producer of the western thrill event to be held in Memorial Coliseum Aug. 21.

South Bay ticket headquarters for the rodeo, a world championship event, which will match top cowboys in contests of skill and daring, are the marshal office, 3231 Torrance Blvd., FA 8-3310.

The rodeo will unfold thrills and spectacle, according to Montana. Some 200 cowboys, 700 posse members, and 150 silver, Indian, and Arabian riders are scheduled to participate.

Three film celebrities, filling the roles of rodeo star, rodeo queen, and grand marshal, will lead the glamorous retinue which also will include trick riders and ropers, clowns, marching bands and stagecoach drivers.
