Eddie Schmidt Goes Today in California Breeders' Stake

Flow Line, the once temporary colt who settled down to a wire-to-wire victory in the Will Rogers Stakes at Hollywood Park on Memorial Day, heads one of the West's best three-year-olds fields so far this year when Hollywood Park stages its \$35,000 added Argonaut Stakes Saturday, June 11.

Because there are so many top three-year-olds campaigning in the West this year, Hollywood Park changed the conditions of the Argonaut from a stakes race for older horses to a feature for sopho-

mores only. The Argonaut, at a mile and one-sixteenth, thus becomes a major stepping stone to the \$100,000 Hollywood Derby to be run July 9. The fast-closing Natego, who almost caught Flow Line in the Will Rogers Stakes, and First Balcony, Nagea and New Policy, who finished third, fourth and fifth in that race, will all come back against Flow Line along with Clown Prince, winner of the Debonair, the first of Hollywood's 1960 stakes for the sophomores.


