

Police Misconduct, Brutality Fought by New L.A. Group

Los Angeles police officers too often deal "arrogantly, excessively, brutally and lawlessly" with residents of the Negro and Mexican-American communities, a group of civic leaders charged this week.

Representatives of the American Civil Liberties Union, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and the Mexican-American community told a press conference at the Biltmore that scores of Los Angeles citizens have complained of police maltreatment in the past year, but there is no adequate redress available to victims.

"Enough of these complaints have been investigated and confirmed to show beyond any reasonable, unprejudiced doubt that a significant number of citizens have been severely abused by the police," Attorney Hugh R. Manes said.

Also attending the session were Attorneys Herman Smith and Morgan Moten, of the NAACP, Attorney Robert Baca and Frank Paz, leader in Mexican-American community.

The group announced formation of a Committee for a Los Angeles Police Review Board, which will propose a new official agency of city government with authority to receive, investigate, and determine complaints of police misconduct.

At present, the group said, complaints are referred to the Bureau of Internal Affairs

Chairman of the Southern California YMCA Drive, J. Edward Day, presented the trophies to Torrance YMCA campaign chairman Albert Isen and to YMCA youth member Patt Conner, who represented 6,000 local boys and girls served by the Y.

This was the third such award to Torrance in the past four years.
