Henry W. Creeger Hospital Board President Fifth Time

At the recent annual meeting of the Torrance Hospital Association, Henry W. Creeger was elected to his fifth consecutive term as president of the board of directors.

Creeger first was voted on to the Board of Directors in 1955 and was immediately elected to the office of President.
