(Continued from Page One) Eskimos. "During the war he served as chaplain with the Calgary Highlanders, taking part in Normandy invasion. Wounded later, he returned home and after the war spent ten years at St. Paul's Church in Fort Garry, Manitoba.

In 1955 he was asked to visit St. Andrew's in Torrance. While reluctant to leave St. Paul's, he felt that the work here presented a great challenge.

Father Percy has been at St. Andrew's a little more than four years. New organizations have flourished, and established ones have been revitalized. The church itself has been enlarged, and the attendance greatly increased.

Father Percy is a priest-associate of The Order of the Holy Cross, and in 1958 was elected president of the Torrance Ministerial Association.

The climax of the program came as a complete surprise to Father Percy, as the narrator casually mentioned, the secret plan of the parish to send Father and Mrs. Percy on a trip to the Holy Land sometime in 1961.

At first, not quite believing he had heard correctly, Father Percy appeared stunned. Later he said that the This-Is-Your-Life program had been such a great honor that he was overwhelmed to hear of the proposed trip as well.

He said, "This is a most sacred and spiritual gift. The most meaningful part is that it will enable me to try to give back, through my experiences in the Holy Land, just a small part of the absolutely

fabulous gift the people of St. Andrew's have made."

Lomita Park Improvements Boost Activity

Recent improvements in the facilities at Lomita County Park have sparked an increase in organized recreation activities there, according to Supervisor Burton C. Chace.

An expanded program of organized community activities at the park has been planned for June by recreation personnel of the county Department of Parks and Recreation.


