He has pointed out that, while most spirituals were born in the revival meeting, they take many forms and reflect many moods. In the revival scene of the forthcoming concert, several types of spirituals will be sung.

A primitive spiritual to be heard is "Somebody's Knockin' at Your Door." "Don't Be Weary, Traveler" is classified as an art song and will be sung by the chorus, and "Great Gettin' Up Mornin'" will represent the Jubilee type of spiritual. For the sermon, Hairston will use James Weldon Johnson's "The Creation" in the style of the old-time Negro preacher.
