**Bank Announces Carson Opening**

The branch will also provide escrow and safe deposit facilities, as well as a night depository for after-hours deposits, and will have a kitchenette-equipped staff-room for the employees. The 9,450 square foot building will be completely air-conditioned, and customers will have plenty of off-street parking space, Ogle said.

Plans for the open house celebration call for special opening ceremonies, refreshments, special displays, free gifts, and a contest offering cash prizes to winners. Ogle said complete plans will be announced soon.
