Local Resident Receives Grant to Attend USC

William C. Hoag, of Torrance, a driver education teacher in the Beverly Hills Unified School District, has been awarded an Allstate Foundation scholarship to attend the basic course in driver education at the University of Southern California, according to Dr. Paul E. Hadley, dean of the USC Summer Session.

Hoag, who resides at 21909 Ladeen Ave., is one of 20 Southern California teachers to receive the Allstate scholarship. This is the eighth year that the Allstate Foundation has provided scholarship funds to the university for advanced study in driver education.

During the past seven summers, the Allstate grants to the university have provided scholarships for 285 high school driver education teachers, according to Dr. Hadley.

These teachers have returned to their schools and have instructed over 100,000 students in the principles and practices of safe driving.

C. J. Weiss, district representative of the Allstate Foundation, stated there is a vital need not only to increase the number of high school students receiving driver education and training, but also to improve the quality of the existing courses.

National Company Awards Torrance Firm for Safety

Officials of The National Supply Company, and its parent organization Armo Steel Corporation, participated in the presentation of the Armo "Iron Man" award to National Supply's Torrance plant.

E. G. Unrath, vice president of The National Supply Company, presented the award to J. D. Spalding, works manager of the Torrance plant on behalf of the plant's employees. Campbell M. Allen, chief safety engineer of Armo Steel Corporation, discussed the Armo safety program.

The presentation took place at a dinner meeting Wednesday at the Plush Horse with 100 persons in attendance.

Other participants included R. S. Gruver, administrative vice president, personal and public relations; William Verity, director of organization and planning; and George B. Cushing, vice president—public relations and advertising of National Supply. Members of the plant safety committee and union representatives were among the special guests.

The National Supply Management Club at the Torrance plant installed its new officers at the meeting.

The Armo "Iron Man" is a bronze figure created by Clement J. Barnhorn, internationally known sculptor, following a number of visits to Armo's main plant at Middletown, Ohio, in 1925. The figure represents a composite of the facial features, build, and clothing of many of the workers that Barnhorn saw at that time. More than three feet high, it stands on a five-foot base.

The trophy has been awarded annually for the

best safety record at an Armo Steel Corporation plant since 1926. Following the merger of the National Supply Company with Armo in 1958, National Supply plants became eligible to compete in 1959. Perfect safety records were made by the National Supply plants at Etan, Pa., and Torrance, both working more than a million man-hours without a single lost-time injury. The Etan plant obtained the Iron Man for the first half of 1960 and Torrance will have it for the remainder of the year.

The Torrance plant's perfect safety record began in January, 1958 and continued for 869 days totaling 3,629,172 manhours. This record is the best ever attained by a National Supply plant, and is the second best of all Armo plants.
